President's Message (Henry Bertram)
 By now, the fervor of the holidays is dying down and we are all planning ahead for Valentine's Day. I hope you all got some archery gear from your favorite gift giver and that your holiday was everything you hoped it would be.
 Making 2009 a great year, having fun and living up to our mission involved a lot of club members who worked very hard. Here are some of the highlights:
 We opened the gates for public access to the range every weekend of the year.
 We made available a place for hunters, archery enthusiasts and target shooters to practice and improve their skills.
 We kept targets on the outdoor range (well, for the most part).
 We stayed out of the way while some nice folks improved the range access road.

We removed a lot of Scotch Broom, an invasive species of plant that the City of Santa Cruz would like us to keep at bay.
 We have built a stack of waivers that is almost 3 inches thick showing that a lot of people came to the indoor range and our shoots.
 We introduced a lot of people to Archery and gave them a good start in our weekend program, largely through the efforts on Randy Redmond.
 We conducted six-week "Introduction to Archery" programs three times; two were through the City of Santa Cruz Parks & Recreation department.
 We moved target 7 to make the world safe for golfers, largely through the efforts of Mike Tracy, with John Thomas kicking things off and with the help of a number of others.
 We had volunteers helping us with range maintenance and improvements.
 We rebuilt our shabby picnic area through the efforts and guidance of Christine Berry and several club members (I found John Thomas there slaving away, alone, a couple of times).
 We had three large 3D shoots that were very successful: Stickbow in the Redwoods, 3D in the Redwoods and Bad Boys of Branciforte. The Bad Boys shoot included two 3D targets that had never been seen before; they were created by Sam and Andy Sterbenz.
 We had a sponsorship program, with Predators and Ralston's contributing.
 We alternated Saturday unmarked 3D shoots with Mt. Madonna Bowmen. They were very successful and the shooters had a lot of fun.
 We bought 11 new 3D targets with proceeds from our Saturday unmarked 3D shoots.
 We held our Indoor Shoot on every first and third Friday evening of the year; twelve Indoor Shoots in all.
 We held our Outdoor shoot every second Sunday (sometimes a lot of people came, sometimes I was there alone, but the shoot was available

every month).
 The stump shoot was on the last Saturday of every month, rain or shine. And most significantly, we had enough people wanting to work and participate that running the club in 2009 was a joy, thank you all!
