## Work Party (Henry Bertram)

There were parallel efforts during the work party. The animals were having foam injected into arrow holes and the indoor storage water patching was being improved. A few animals remained without patching due to a shortage of materials. It seems that even unopened, the foam doesn't last forever. Since it was approaching noon, we decided to put the animals away and get more foam for next time. The re-patching on the interior went well. Inspection during subsequent rain storms proved the patch was working. The remaining leakage is through the outside wall where it is covered by bracing for the interior wall where we couldn't reach and on the outside of the records storage room where we had not yet started work. We also get a bit of leakage at the back corner of the side door.

For a future work party we need a person adept at carpentry to rebuild the ramp to our rest room, 20 years of wet weather has rotted the plywood making it a bit soft.

The last day of the month I got a call from Non-Working member Rick Chace saying he wanted to help remove the downed wood blocking the maintenance road between targets 1 and 2 but didn't want to do it alone for safety reasons. I met him at the range and he diced those suckers into manageable sections in a couple of hours. He also cut a bench into part of the thing so anyone Rick's height or above should find a nice place to rest on the right side of the road as they walk up to target two.
