Archers Intro (Henry Bertram)

We are having another Introduction to Archery workshop Saturday mornings from 10AM to 11:30Am starting on July 10th and ending August 14th. There are still openings as of this writing so if you know anyone who wants to start archery with a solid foundation, please have them send me an email or call me.

We have done a few of these classes recently and they have helped add some new members to our ranks.

What Excuse? (Henry Bertram)

My mom used to bake regularly, and for birthdays, made excellent cakes. She used to mix confectioners sugar with a very small amount of non-fat milk and a drop of food coloring to make icing, reserving a bit for a different color to scribe "Happy Birthday" on the top with the name of one of the children. This, however, is a different kind of icing. It's the kind of icing that causes airplane's wings to become heavy, impeding their ability to fly. It's the kind of icing that causes Larry's arrow to drift ever so subtly low, missing the spot. Not happy icing, no. It is, in fact, like airplane wing and propeller icing, is somewhat tragic.

Is that the best indoor shoot excuse ever? I don't know.

Jim Martinez had the sun in his eyes last year, causing him to narrowly miss another 300 round with his freestyle bow. I have heard tails of the mysterious effects that cause sudden

horizontal arrow drift when shooting on lane 7, next to the east side wall.

I have often noticed that both the NFAA indoor round target and the Vegas target, like their outdoor 3D brethren, tend to “jump the string.”

In case you have missed it, an occasional gust of wind hits the “Don’t Advance until All Clear” sign and protects the target lighting. When that happens, the wind is forced sharply downward causing Wind Sheer, taking your arrow with it.

During a cold spell, that wind moves along the floor. When it hits the base bales it is forced sharply aloft causing updrafts that can force your arrow to impact above your intended target.

We are also cursed by sudden bursts of side wind in either direction that, while hardly detectable to human senses, wreak havoc on arrow flight.

Updrafts and downdrafts in the indoor range are, luckily, somewhat more predictable, in that downdrafts are confined to winter and downdrafts to summer. Using the stove during the winter, of course, can cause both updrafts and wind sheer so be wary.

Here are the current excuses organized alphabetically. I thought about organizing them by severity, but laziness overtook me and, after all, severity is in the eye of the beholder.

- Cross winds
- Downdrafts
- Icing
- Jumping the string
- Mysterious effects emanating from the East wall
- Side winds
- Momentary blindness due to the sun in your eyes
- Turbulence
- Updrafts
- Wind Sheer

Perhaps we should encourage the development of sight compensation

devices. If you have had other devastating problems in the indoor range please send them in.

Maggie and Ruby were shooting continuous draw weight bows and Maggie was actually using a sight hence she gets an asterisk (*) by her score.

In case you were wondering how the shoot went, Karen was kind enough to chronicle the shot positions:

- 1) Standard (picked by Henry, go figure)
- 2) “Avatar” holding the release hand upside down and pumping the shot twice before the release. It should be noted that the original idea included leaping toward the target and releasing while in the air but Henry put the kybosh on that for safety reason (mainly his own)
- 3) Squatting (no comments please, they were already done during the shoot)
- 4) Aborigine: Standing on one leg with the other against your shin
- 5) Squatting again

- 6) On one leg
- 7) On one leg (or the other, I forget)
- 8) On a knee
- 9) Sitting
- 10) Backwards (watch that arrow point)
- 11) Singing (dang, this was difficult... to listen to)
- 12) One foot on a tree about hip height
